



Police are appealing for witnesses to an incident which occurred at approximately 1pm on Tuesday 17 February in Udimore, Rye. An elderly lady was tricked into letting a man into her home. While in the property he stole £120 in cash. The man was white, with short brown hair, of medium

build and about 5ft 8in tall.

Title: Crimewatch Appeal re:- Hastings Rape

BBC Crimewatch will be featuring the rape of a 16-year-old girl on the West Hill at Hastings in the programme due to be transmitted on Thursday 26 February. A reward of £10,000 has already been offered for information which leads to the arrest and conviction of the offender. The local girl was attacked after walking up Priory Road from Hastings Town Centre on 21 December last year. She was approached from behind by a man, taken to the grassed area on the West Hill and raped. Detective Inspector Trevor Bowles, who is leading the hunt for the attacker, said: We have worked closely with the BBC in order to produce an accurate reconstruction of the events of the early morning of 21 December 2003. I am very grateful to the BBC for their assistance with this investigation.

may be on its last legs, but it still has had a few surprises in store for us. A cold snap at the end of January brought a lot of ducks on to the reserve, including Shoveler, Teal, and Gadwall. Drake Gadwall. with it's subdued but rather Ringed Plovers on the dapper grey plumage, always reminds me of a city gent in a suit! At Castle Water, a maximum of six Bittern have been recorded, up to 24 Little Egrets and three singing Cetti's Warbler. Two Long -tailed Ducks, an uncommon Arctic visitor, have turned up at Ternery Pool on a couple of occasions, as has a rather unexpected Avocet.

There have been up to seven Long-eared Owls on the reserve during January and February, roosting in trees around Castle Water and the Narrow Pits. These splendid birds have been very accommodating to visitors, showing absolutely no concern when faced with a wall of binoculars, telescopes and cameras.

Birds are already starting to prepare for the breeding season. Thrushes and Skylarks are singing their hearts out as I speak, the beach are beginning to

display, and there has already been the first Sand Martin of the year! And it's not only the birds that are stirring. The first

butterflies of the year are already putting in an appearance, including Small Tortoiseshells, and more surprisingly, a Painted Lady! Spring really is iust around the corner.

However their was some nutter running around the ship causing alarm and panic simply because he told the truth that there is a lifeboat big enough for everyone – please go to the

boat deck! And warning them that awful consequences awaited them if they did not heed the warning. They may chuck stuff at him call him names but would they consider what motivated him to run around trying to save them. It is love. It is God's love for you personally that will touch you when you are aware of how deep that love is that no matter how rotten you may have been in life or even if you think your nose has been kept clean for six decades; you have supported a million charities; Attended church every Sunday! You're still a sinner and need saving by God's wonderful grace. (cf. Romans 10:13). You see Christianity is firstly a vertical relationship with the living God. After that it expands to a horizontal relationship with each other – simply put Love God (first) Love People. He is the vitality without Whose Personal involvement there is no Christianity at all.




